- Approval of minutes from March Chair (2 minutes)
 - O Daryl made motion to approve; Troy seconded; all approved
- Action item review Jenn Bies (3 minutes)
- COVID-19 Approval of PPP loan. Update on CSWC resilience planning Cathy (10 minutes)
 - Loan forgiveness is predicated upon not overspending above typical operating costs and not sustaining staffing FTE at same levels during the loan coverage period
 - Bob motioned to approve; Elizabeth seconded; all approved the resolution
- Approval of comments to the ACOE on <u>Portland Meadows/Prologis expansion</u>
 - Deadline for comments tomorrow; another opportunity to comment to DSL next month
 - Went with argument that it would be a net loss to watershed as a whole to do mitigation in the proposed location, as well as concerns about lag time between construction and mitigation projects to accommodate golfing for a period of time
 - ACOE review is intended to confirm the project meets the law and administrative rules – this is the best nexus for our advocacy with them
 - Will have more time to prepare for DSL comment period
 - Consider if drainage would be a good reason for why we want them to mitigate in Pen 2
 - Climate change is creating more risk of localized flooding, which also supports the argument that mitigation needs to happen within the same drainage area that is being impacted
 - Might be a chance that new legislation could be enacted this summer
 - Executive Director or Board Chair should sign these letters
 - Kathy moved to submit letter with changed signatory to Cathy Kellon;

Troy seconded; all approved

- Committee Reports JEDI 'ground rules' (Meei 5 minutes); Land use (Bob 5 minutes); Gala (Cathy 2 minutes);
 - o Land use
 - New development planned by Grant Butte, 40-45-lot housing development adjacent to wetlands. Friends of Grant Butte are involved.
 - Staff are working to raise awareness about local conservation issues via social media not stating positions unless Board approves (e.g., action alters on Prologis and Grant Butte)
 - o Alt Gala
 - Week of May 18: online silent auction; video; special appeal letter
- Board retreat update Sunny (5 minutes)
 - o Postponed due to COVID-19
 - Better to do this in person, but summer vacations could impact attendance
 - Evaluate at May Board meeting
- Sewer line and City position
