EVENTS AND OUTREACH

- Congratulations to the three winners of our 2016 Slough Celebration Award! This year we are honoring
 Brenda Demaree from the Purdy Community Engagement Team; Dave Helzer, Fred MacGregor, and
 Nadine Meyers from BES and Clayton Solberg from Bergeson Marine Company with the *Lower Slough Refugia Project*; and Laura LoForti, Damaris Webb, and S. Renee Mitchell from the *Vanport Mosaic Project*.
- 2017 events calendar finalized and includes a new Pollinators workshop and Wetlands 101, not offered since 2010. Check website in mid-December for a full list of dates and locations.
- Explorando will be relocated due to the WP park entry improvement project- current host site is Colwood Gold Course. Preliminary planning includes a canoe launch and scavenger hunt in PPR's 35-acre forest restoration area.
- Stronger partnership with Community Cycling Center underway with potential rides around Smith/Bybee Lakes and community education on slough history and wetlands.
- CSWC will be represented at the Green Festival Expo Dec 9-11 @ the convention center. Our

STEWARDSHIP

- November 5th @ Smith and Bybee 9 students from Project Blueprint came out for a bird walk in the morning led by Troy Clark and beaver caging in the afternoon.
- November 7th @ Confort and 47th MYC finished removing and replacing old/disfunctional beaver cages
- November 21st CSWC Tech Team The tech team worked on prioritization criteria, identifying and discussing gaps in project list related to relevant information and gaps in areas of concern/goals
- Currently reviewing and requesting interviews for Stewardship Intern applicants
- Adele will stay on through January 21. New Stewardship coordinator to be hired by January 16

EDUCATION

- We began building a Bird Blind in a collaboration with Portland Parks & Rec overlooking East Whitaker Pond - future students can add to the structure by weaving in cuttings of dogwood, cottonwood, and alder.
- Slough School advisory council met to discuss the Education Program's role in CSWC's strategic planning and talk about safety policy
- Kirk & Amira have begun their NAYA after school programming
- Lynn Reaney's 5th grade class from Sweetbriar elementary won the Watershed Dance Video contest
- In the month of November, Slough School had 291 student contacts and 40 adult contacts, serving 14 classes in classroom and field programming.

VOLUNTEERS

 We are now actively recruiting business and partnerships for Stewardship Saturdays beginning in January. The events are on the website and will be posted through our regular recruitment channels. • Kelsie met with Hanna for a one on one training to go over past pracitces in volunteer recruitment, projects and ideas for effectively moving forward into the new year.

NADAKA

- No Ivy Day- October 29th (87 volunteers- partnered with College Possible High School Group)
- Pollinator Workshop with EMSWCD- November 5th (21 attendees)
- Bird Walk at Nadaka- November 12th (11 attendees)
- HB Lee Middle School SUN Program- Came every other week twice a week since September to do stewardship in the community garden and forest.
- Worked with two high school and one middle school students to do volunteer/stewardship work at Nadaka 11/5 & 11/19. Each student volunteered for a total of 9 hours.
- Working with partners to finalize event dates for the next 6 months at Nadaka.
- Ambassador program is up and running with 5 stipended volunteers and 2 unpaid volunteers.
